From the Pastor:

**Pope Francis relates words to us about Jesus that are both comforting and challenging:**

**“When we seek Jesus, we discover that he is waiting to welcome us, to offer us his love. And this fills your heart with such wonder that you can hardly believe it, and this is how your faith grows – through encounter with a Person, through encounter with the Lord. Some people say, ‘No, I prefer to read about faith in books!’ It is important to read about faith, but look, on its own, this is not enough! What is important is our encounter with Jesus, our encounter with him, and this is what gives you faith, because he is the One who gives it to you!”**

**“The mystery of Jesus’ voice is evocative. Only think that from our mother’s womb, we learn to recognize her voice and that of our father; it is from the tone of a voice that we perceive love or contempt, affection or coldness. Jesus’ voice is unique! If we learn to distinguish it, he guides us on the path of life, a path that goes beyond even the abyss of death.”**

**“Let the Risen Jesus enter your life; welcome him as a friend, with trust: he is life! If up till now you have kept him at a distance, step forward. He will receive you with open arms. If you have been indifferent, take a risk; you won’t be disappointed. If following him seems difficult, don’t be afraid; trust him, be confident that he is close to you. He is with you, and he will give you the peace you are looking for and the strength to love as he would have you do.”**

**“Jesus gave himself up to death voluntarily in order to reciprocate the love of God the Father, in perfect union with his will, to demonstrate his love for us. On the cross Jesus ‘loved me and gave himself for me’ (Galatians 2:20). Each one of us can say: ‘He loved me and gave himself for me.’ Each one can say this ‘for me.’”**
